Little Johnny showed up at a birthday party with a bag of peanuts. This was a big surprise because Johnny wasn't known for his generosity—his neighbors called him “Selfish Johnny.” So, when he brought snacks to share, it seemed like a miraculous turnabout.

“That’s so nice of you, Johnny,” said one mom. “Thank you for sharing these peanuts with your friends.”

Johnny smiled and replied, “You’re welcome! I don’t really like peanuts. I sucked all the chocolate off my peanut M&Ms and decided I’d share the rest!”

Sometimes, our sharing could use a little more thoughtfulness, right? But the heart of the matter is that sharing is central to our Christian calling, even if it sometimes takes a little encouragement.

Reflections on Hebrews 13:16

Hebrews is a book filled with encouragement for weary believers. The author reminds us of the importance of action—not just thinking about good works or intending to be generous, but actively doing good and sharing with others. Hebrews 13:16 speaks to the heart of our faith: living in a way that reflects God’s love.

In our world today, there’s no shortage of people in need. Think about families who have lost everything in hurricanes, individuals living in temporary housing, or those in warming shelters during the cold. For these neighbors, basic items like hygiene kits, cleanup buckets, and blankets can mean the difference between despair and hope.
